THE BP DEEPWATER HORIZON DISASTER: AN OVERVIEW OF IMMEDIATE AND LONG-TERM LEGAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONSEQUENCES

The explosion of the BP Deepwater Horizon and subsequent massive oil discharge into the Gulf of Mexico poses unprecedented legal, social, economic and environmental questions. After the devastation caused by the Exxon Valdez, the United States created a public-private statutory scheme to address large-scale environmental disasters. This statutory scheme, known as the Oil Pollution Act, has never been fully tested until now. We will discuss the immediate impact of this economic and environmental disaster and offer a preliminary analysis of the public-private structure and how the international legal system can and should strike a balance between economic development and environmental protection.
